Coralwood School is the only public school in DeKalb County dedicated to serving preschool through kindergarten children in an inclusion model.

Our research-based educational model includes 12 collaborative and co-teaching classrooms in which six to seven children with special needs and ten to fourteen typically developing children are educated together. Research shows that this model results in significant gains for special education students, including higher levels of social play, more appropriate social interactions and greater gains in language, cognitive and motor development. Additionally, Coralwood has four self-contained classrooms that serve children who need a higher level of support. Children in the self-contained classes engage in multiple learning experiences with typically developing children throughout the school day. The classrooms at Coralwood are led by highly specialized teachers and para-professionals who teach to a broad set of students with varied needs. The teachers work closely with the following therapists: speech/language, occupational, physical, vision, hearing, behavioral and recreational. Primarily, these therapists provide services to children in the classroom and include both special needs and typical children in various therapies.

## WHAT IS THE CORALWOOD FOUNDATION?

Coralwood Foundation, Inc. was incorporated in May 2005 to create a permanent endowment fund, the income of which is used to promote excellence in early childhood inclusion education at Coralwood School, and to provide a vehicle for long-term financial and volunteer support for Coralwood. The Foundation funds the educational innovations of teachers and other professionals at Coralwood, as well as a Director of Development who writes grants and raises funds for specific educational initiatives.

Currently, the efforts of the Foundation's Board of Directors are focused on the following initiatives:

- Providing learning opportunities, grants for classroom initiatives and professional development for our school staff;
- Supporting the financial goals of the Foundation through fundraisers such as our Annual Auction and grant writing activities;
- Working with the DeKalb County School District (DCSD) and the Board of Education to maximize opportunities for Coralwood's campus in order to provide enhanced educational facilities for our children;
- Implementing a marketing and communications plan that will position Coralwood School as the premier inclusion school in Georgia;
- Maintaining the website as a central location for comprehensive information about Coralwood, the Foundation, the PTA, related events, and parent resources; and
- Actively engaging Coralwood alumni, parents and friends in the continued work of the Foundation through community involvement and outreach.

The Foundation views these projects as fundamental elements to improve the education of our children now and in the future.



## 2016-2017 CORALWOOD FOUNDATION MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Coralwood Foundation would like to thank you for your generous support during the 2016-2017 school year. Here's a recap of all that we accomplished during the 2016-2017 school year:

- **HOMECOMING** In September, Coralwood Foundation celebrated its 11th Anniversary and kicked off the school year with our Annual Homecoming Event. It was a huge success with over 200 current and alumni families attending. Everyone enjoyed the opportunity to reunite with old friends, staff, and teachers along with meeting new friends. Kids' activities were the highlight of Homecoming with a parade, playground time and entertainment provided by DJ Willy Wow. Many thanks to Valerie Daniel for chairing this fun and meaningful event.
- **CORALWOOD CHALLENGE** The Coralwood Foundation's Annual Challenge seeks financial commitment each year from parents and supporters in order to fund the long term goals of the school. One of the primary goals is to maintain a healthy endowment to ensure funding for future generations of Coralwood students and educators. Another goal is financing the additional specialized training our staff needs to create Coralwood's wonderful results. Each year, the board reviews needs from equipment to curriculum to skill sets and determines where the resources from each year's Challenge can make the biggest impact. This year's Challenge raised over \$45,000.
- **PROJECTS WITH PURPOSE** In September, the Coralwood Foundation worked with employees from LexisNexis for a day of volunteering. They installed new sandboxes, installed paver bricks on the walkway from the street to the school, repaired and improved a broken sidewalk and stairs leading from the parking lot to the school, painted murals on walls, constructed a pergola in the corral area, installed a safety rail on portions of the nature trail, and many other projects to improve our school grounds. Their generous commitment made a significant impact that will be enjoyed for many years at Coralwood! Thank you to Julie Dascher for organizing this valuable day of contributions.
- **GOATS** The Coralwood Foundation arranged for 30 goats to come to our Coralwood Nature Trail to clean (eat) the English Ivy and other invasive plants that are threatening the health of our trees. They did a great job and provided an entertaining learning opportunity for our students while they worked.
- HOT (Higher Opportunities for Teachers) The Coralwood Foundation sponsored training and learning opportunities for teachers and staff. This year, teachers and staff participated in STEM training, Lindamood Bell instruction, Lucy Calkins training, sensory/behavior training, an art conference, and a STEM conference. We also supported project-based learning (PBL) by providing teachers with funds to purchase needed supplies as they used PBL in their classrooms this year. Thank you to Cathy Ethridge for overseeing these professional development opportunities.
- **GRANTS** We are especially appreciative of the Rhame Family Foundation grant, which helped us purchase an interactive magnetic wall for our playground, as well as speech and occupational therapy resources.
- **STEM CAMP** The Coralwood Foundation sponsored a 2-week inclusion day-camp fostering project based learning and scientific inquiry for Coralwood's students who participated in the camp.

The Coralwood Challenge helps bridge the gap between what Coralwood receives from school district funding and what the school needs to provide a high-quality inclusion education environment. 

Inclusive practices are an integral characteristic of schools that achieve strong measures of academic success. Why? Because:

- Students are educated whenever appropriate in general education classrooms with teachers skilled in the content taught.
- Opportunities to progress in the general education curriculum are greatly facilitated through inclusive practices.
- High expectations for all students are the norm.
- Instruction is differentiated to engage students on the basis of the skill sets, interests, and learning styles.
- Collaboration between general and special education staff results in flexible grouping that includes varied small group instruction, large group, and paired instruction.
- Students are actively engaged in instruction and in their own learning.
- Instructional accommodations and "scaffolding" are used to increase access to learning and academic success.
- Individual education plans identify specific accommodations, modifications and goals for each student.
- Strong parent-school partnerships are the norm.
- Ongoing training and staff development is encouraged and supported.




