Our research-based educational model includes 12 collaborative and co-teaching classrooms in which six children with special needs and 10 - 14 typically developing children are educated together. Research shows that this model results in significant gains for special education students, including higher levels of social play, more appropriate social interactions and greater gains in language, cognitive and motor development. Additionally, Coralwood has four self-contained classrooms that serve children who need a higher level of support. Children in the self-contained classes engage in multiple learning experiences with typically developing children throughout the school day. The classrooms at Coralwood are led by highly specialized teachers and para-professionals who teach to a broad set of students with varied needs. The teachers work closely with the following therapists: speech/language, occupational, physical, vision, hearing, behavioral and recreational. Primarily, these therapists provide services to children in the classroom and include both children with special needs and typically developing children in various therapies.

WHAT IS THE CORALWOOD FOUNDATION?

What is the Coralwood Foundation? - Coralwood Foundation, Inc. was incorporated in May 2005 to create a permanent endowment fund, the income of which is used to promote excellence in early childhood inclusion education at Coralwood School, and to provide a vehicle for long-term financial and volunteer support for Coralwood. The Foundation funds the educational innovations of teachers and other professionals at Coralwood, as well as a Director of Development who raises funds and develops community partnerships for specific educational initiatives.

Currently, the efforts of the Foundation's Board of Directors are focused on the following initiatives:

- **Providing learning opportunities, grants for classroom initiatives and professional development for our school staff;**
- **Supporting the financial goals of the Foundation through fundraisers such as the Coralwood Challenge and Annual Auction;**
- **Working with the DeKalb County School District (DCSD) and the Board of Education to maximize opportunities for Coralwood's campus in order to provide enhanced educational facilities for our children;**
- **Implementing a marketing and communications plan that will position Coralwood School as the premiere inclusion school in Georgia;**
- **Maintaining the website as a central location for comprehensive information about Coralwood, the Foundation, the PTA, related events and parent resources; and**
- **Actively engaging Coralwood alumni, parents and friends in the continued work of the Foundation through community involvement and outreach.**

The Foundation views these projects as fundamental elements to improve the education of our children now and in the future.



2018-2019 CORALWOOD FOUNDATION

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

With your generous support during the 2018-2019 school year, The Coralwood Foundation raised over \$80,000 for our school. Here's a recap of all that we accomplished:

- **HOMECOMING** In September, the Coralwood Foundation hosted our 8th annual Homecoming event. Students, alumni, teachers, staff and family members partied on the playground and danced to DJ Jammin' Jay's festive tunes. Many thanks to retired Coralwood teacher and Foundation Board member, Sylvia Goggin, for chairing this fun and meaningful event. Save the date for our next celebration on Friday, September 6, 2019. We can't wait to welcome our current Kindergarteners back as alumni.
- **CORALWOOD CHALLENGE** The Coralwood Challenge helps bridge the gap between what Coralwood receives from school district funding and what the school needs to provide a high-quality inclusion education environment. More than 200 households gave \$56,800 this school year. These funds were used to purchase a laminator machine with six rolls of film; a color printer and three cartridges of black and color ink for every classroom (16 printers total); new blinds for all the classrooms to increase comfort and security; in-school field trips focused on the performing arts and science; a new electronic reading program subscription for the entire school (Raz Kids); and many other items that make Coralwood an even stronger learning environment. A huge thank you to Jennifer Blakely and Kristen Bryant for leading this effort that makes a significant impact on the school.
- **HOT (Higher Opportunities for Teachers)** The Foundation continued to support training and learning opportunities for teachers and staff. This year, teachers and staff participated in different conferences on legal issues, art and psychology; Lindamood Bell training (LiPS – Phoneme Sequencing Program for Reading, Spelling and Speech); and numerous teachers utilized funds for project-based learning (PBL) activities. Thank you to Cathy Ethridge for overseeing these professional development opportunities.
- **CORALWOOD AUCTION** Coralwood Foundation's 17th Annual Auction "Totally Awesome Auction" took place in February at Briarcliff Woods Beach Club. We raised over \$22,000. Amanda Cook and Anu Ghosh organized a phenomenal 80s-themed event. The funds are being held to use for new inclusive playground equipment.
- **GRANTS** We are especially grateful to the Rhame Family Foundation grant, which helped us purchase the following: visual and tactile academic supports (ABLLS-R materials kit); differentiated math centers and Mastering the Basic Math Facts in Addition and Subtraction books for Kindergarten teachers; adapted play kit for students with visual, cognitive, and physical disabilities; Science Readers (Georgia Edition Complete Kits): Kindergarten; literacy and numeracy support for Pre-K student success (Color Changing Light Table, Light Table Manipulative Center, Road to Reading Activity Center, Space-Saver Mobile Art Center).
- **STEM CAMP** The Coralwood Foundation sponsored a week-long inclusion day camp fostering project based learning and scientific inquiry for Coralwood's students who participated in the camp.


education can be seen all throughout our community. Our alumni are graduating from high school and already making the world a better place like our alumnus of the year, Steven Peay.






